Marist Characteristics

Presence - Marcellin wanted his followers to do nothing less than immerse themselves in the lives of the young - "constant presence" among them, he called it - and to show them at all times what it is to live as a good Christian and citizen.

Family Spirit - It is something tangibly experienced. You feel it in the warmth of the College. You feel it in the welcome and hospitality. You feel it in the lack of pretence or arrogance. You feel it in the sense of belonging and the broad inclusivity of that. You feel it in people's care and kindness. You feel it in trust and respect.

In the Way of Mary - Marcellin knew Mary would be the best possible model of one who prized each human being for their own sake. Mary shows by her humility and generosity, the claims of the common good. In a world which put up and pulled down others, Mary revealed that the real God was someone with dusty feet.

Overarching Position Statement

A Students With Disability Education Assistant at St Marcellin Catholic College will undertake to build community as a priority. They should personally demonstrate our motto of Strong Minds and Gentle Hearts. Students With Disability Education Assistants are encouraged to actively participate in professional growth opportunities where possible.

It is important that they are able to foster high quality relationships with students to ensure that each student is treated with dignity and feels a sense of belonging.

This position requires an individual to possess compassion, humility, patience, agility and excellent communication skills.

Pastorally, education assistants should be aligned with a vision of restorative practice across the College where correction is just, kind and forgiving.

Key Responsibilities

Catholic Ethos and Marist Traditions

- Demonstrate a personal commitment to the College Vision and Values underpinning the delivery of a Catholic education to students in our College community.
- Actively work to promote the charism of Saint Marcellin Champagnat and the mission and life of the Catholic Church within the College.
- Uphold the value and dignity of each person in relationships with staff, parents and students.
- Welcome our community warmly. Demonstrate a capacity to build a community where belonging prevails.
- Hold an image of all of our students as competent, capable, creative, responsible, resourceful and resilient.





Classroom Practices

- Work closely with the Educator in the support of students in their care
- Help to ensure the organisation, management and maintenance of a safe and secure educational environment
- Support the maintenance and use of specialised equipment including mobility devices and supports, specialised seating, computers and digital technologies, augmentative and assistive communication resources etc
- Adapt and modify the classroom environment, materials and activities as required
- Assist with observing, charting and recording student activities, skills performance or specific behaviours
- Work 1:1 and in small-group settings with students with complex and diverse needs, including students who may experience significant difficulties with emotional regulation, communication and behaviour.
- Provide consistent, responsive and individualised support in accordance with student support, behaviour and safety plans.
- Support students during periods of dysregulation, using proactive, trauma-aware and restorative approaches to maintain safety, dignity and connection.
- Respond calmly and appropriately to behaviours of concern, which may include verbal aggression, physical aggression, absconding or other behaviours that may present a risk of injury to the student, staff or peers.
- Demonstrate the capacity to maintain professional composure, follow established safety and escalation procedures, and seek additional assistance when required.
- Work collaboratively with educators, College leadership, families and relevant professionals to implement agreed strategies and promote student engagement, regulation, independence and inclusion.
- Participate in relevant training and professional learning to safely and effectively support students with complex needs.
- Implement and/or supervise hygiene and self-care programs, such as feeding, dressing, drinking, catheterisations and toileting including the cleaning of students
- Assist students with administering medication, dressing, bathing, toileting, lifting where necessary
- Assist with the care, monitoring and supervision of students' outdoor activities, including before school, recess and lunch time periods
- Assist the educator with the general care and wellbeing of students, including attending to students with minor illnesses e.g. colds and the administration of minor first aid.
- Implementation of the College's Behaviour Support Procedure and Class Charter
- Fulfil supervision duties as required by the duty roster
- Attend meetings and professional learning as necessary
- Other duties as requested by the Principal.
